Ongoing collaborative research focuses on understanding and predicting the range expansion of invasive plants in North America. Future directions could involve plant-insect interactions and invasive species management.

The successful applicant will join an engaged lab and department at the University of Ottawa, and have access to resources (e.g., herbarium, Experimental Farm) and partnerships at AAFC.
